# I year PhD Forum

**On September 9th (8.45-18.00) and 10th (8.45-13.30), 2024**, during the Forum of the PhD course in Public Governance, Management and Policy, PhD students of the 39th cycle are going to present the progress, any preliminary results of their research and will have the opportunity to obtain feedback from a pre-assigned **blind** discussant.

## About the PhD Forum

Each PhD student will have a maximum of 15 minutes to present their research plan and any preliminary results. The discussant will have a maximum of 5 minutes for public discussion but will be able to send more in-depth comments to the doctoral student and/or delve deeper in following meetings.

Questions for clarification from the audience will be accepted after the slot allocated to the individual doctoral student and the discussant, for a maximum of 10 minutes. Participants are invited to ask clarifying questions during the presentation.

All researchers are invited to deepen the discussion with the doctoral students also on other occasions and/or in appropriate bilateral meetings.

## Guidelines for PhD Students on how to organize their presentation

The elements that Phd Students are invited to talk about during their presentation are the following:

- (1) description of the research topic and the specific research objectives in the doctoral project (recalling and highlighting the connection with the description of the research topic associated to the scholarship);
- (2) methodologies;
- (3) project timeline (if applicable to the specific research project, provide information on the possible possibility of having access to the data) and discussion on feasibility (any risks and possible solutions);
- (4) possible in-depth analysis of a specific project/chapter of the thesis.

In the case of research works with co-authors, the presence of co-authors must be clearly indicated. The structure of the presentation can follow the one proposed or be organized differently, trying to provide adequate information on all the underlying elements.

Doctoral students are invited to send to "PhD in Public Governance, Management and Policy" [phd.publicgomap@unibo.it](mailto:phd.publicgomap@unibo.it) the slides, no later than **September 2nd at 5pm**, in copy their supervisor and co-supervisor.

If the slides used in the presentation are rich in images and with little explanatory text, the doctoral student is invited to also send a document supporting the slides for bullet items (not a draft) in which the main links of the presentation come out.

Student presentations may take place in both Italian and English; the English language will not necessarily be used in all presentations. The slides used may be in both Italian and English.
